When claims are received they are entered into database, assigned claim number; An ACIC background check and Medicaid check is then conducted; Acknowledgement letter is sent to applicant and information requests are sent to law enforcement and providers. Once information has been received, info is compiled into a detailed summary for Board review and decision.
