The file is then passed on to the Executive Director for initial review and assignment. Once the claim is assigned to an Investigator, the Investigator reviews the available crime report for eligibility requirements and is responsible for obtaining any other information required to make said determination. The Executive Director and Investigators meet on a weekly basis for a Decision Meeting. At the Decision Meeting, the Investigators present all of their cases and present the proposed decision letter to the Executive Director for signature.

Further, the Executive Director sits on the Joint Victim Services Taskforce which was created to facilitate cooperation and collaboration between State and Federal Victim Services.
