Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. • Explain the responsibilities of your office in processing a claim: Colorado has a decentralized system for the administration of crime victim compensation program activity which includes processing of applications and disbursement of compensation funds. The Office of Victims Programs responsibilities in regard to claim processing involve 1) providing on-going technical assistance requested by local cvc programs; and, 2) routine monitoring of state standards outlining baseline claim processing requirements for local cvc programs. • How long does it take to process a VOCA claim? Colorado State Standards for the Administration of Crime Victim Compensation Programs requires cvc claims to be processed within 45 working days, and no later than 60 days, from receipt of a completed application to the CVC Board's initial eligibility determination. • How long does it take to cut a check for a VOCA claim? Local CVC programs disburse CVC funds on a monthly basis, generally after a regularly scheduled claim review meeting. The Colorado State Standards for the Administration of Crime Victim Compensation Programs requires the Judicial District Administrator to issue payments on a victim compensation claim within ten working days of receipt of the signed payment authorizations submitted by a CVC Board.

When an application packet comes in, the intake specialist assigns an initial claim status. If the application and police/incident report is complete, the claim moves to the eligibility determination process. If the packet includes an itemized bill, the verification specialist will verify them at the same time as the claims investigator determines claim eligibility to ensure a timely decision. Staff is available to assist the victim/claimant in obtaining the needed documentation and answering any questions/concerns they may have throughout this process.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

When we have a Federal case, we work directly with the FBI advocate/liaison to get the information needed in a letter format which answers the critical questions needed for us to move forward with processing the claim.

VOCA funds continue to assist the State of Georgia in providing direct benefits to victims and witnesses of violent crimes, as well as their families. In addition to benefits, our VOCA funds help us to sustain our three Customer Service Representatives (CSRs), the Victim Services Coordinator (VSC), Content and Design Manager, as well as our database administrator, which are all critical to the work we do to ensure we give the best service to crimes victims. Our Customer Service staff continue to ensure that claim statuses, information needed to process claims and payment information can be readily provided without victims having to be transferred to another staff person. The Content and Design Manager continues to provide much needed training to those who directly serve victims (i.e., advocates, medical providers, etc.) by increasing their knowledge of the Program, as well as, training on the Victims Compensation Portal.
