Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. When we receive an application, two letters are sent out. The first is the acknowledgement letter sent to the victim/claimant informing them we received their application and it was complete. It also gives them their claims analyst contact information and the claim number assigned. They have 35 days to respond with their medical/dental or funeral bills related to the crime. If no response the claim is denied. The second letter is mailed to the law enforcement agency the crime was reported to. We request information from the detective regarding the circumstances surrounding the incident and the victim's involvement if any. We also request a copy of the official police report. If the information provided indicates illegal activity or contributory misconduct by the victim, the claim is denied. If no negative information is provided and the case was sent to the prosecutor's office, a request is sent to them as well. Once prosecution information is received, the bills submitted are verified by the analyst and submitted for payment. The victim/claimant can appeal any denial by requesting an appeal hearing in writing within 30 days. Once their written request is received an administrative law judge is contacted and an appeal hearing is scheduled. Once the decision from the ALJ is rendered, and the victim/claimant still disagrees, they can request that the ALJ's decision be reviewed by a sub-committee of our board of trustees. The decision of the sub-committee is final.

Our division has been forced to develop procedures for working from home due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Processing time was impacted slightly.
