We get the application in, enter the name, address, crime, summary, etc. into the CVR software program, request any necessary information that wasn't included or necessary corrections to the information that was included, enter the claims into the system, make the application "Ready For Board," produce an agenda of all of the applications that are ready for the board and supplemental claims that are ready, and mail everything to the board members who meet monthly to make the decisions on the cases that we mailed to them.

Any application where the victim was incarcerated, in probation or paroled during the five-year period prior to the crime would be denied. As of August 1, 2018, that five-year period was lowered to three years. Denials for felony convictions were subsequently removed by Act 418 of 2019.

Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

The VACs in Louisiana are very helpful in assisting the victims and with giving them our information to contact us for monetary assistance. We also have a representative in each parish in the state who meets with people who were victimized or those who represent someone who was victimized in that parish.

We send out posters to other agencies, providers, etc. who deal with victims We attend functions regarding crime and violence in the Louisiana where we hand out our brochures. We make sure that the funeral homes, medical facilities, mental health providers, etc., know about us so that they can direct victims to us.
