The number of applications received this year is down compared to last year. We feel this is primarily due to the pandemic. However, we are exploring all possibilities for the drop in numbers. We will be doing more to promote the program in the coming year.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Once the application is received it is reviewed for completeness and entered into our electronic database typically within 5 days. Once entered in the database, staff immediately request law enforcement information. Waiting for law enforcement information is the most time consuming part of the application review process. Once the law enforcement information is received, it is reviewed and a determination of approve/deny is made. Victims are notified in writing of our decision. Claims are processed/payments made approximately twice per month. Once the claim is verified as eligible it's entered into our database. The request for payment is transmitted to the Business Office and approximately 5-7 days later a check is cut.

There have been no emerging issues impacting our ability to meet the needs of crime victims.

CVC Program staff work closely with our Federal counterparts throughout the CVC Application/claim review process.

The CVC Program will soon have a new online application system. This improvement will help make us more efficient and will make it easier for victims to apply as they will no longer have to worry about completing a paper application and mailing it or trying to figure out how to email the application. The new online application system will bring applications into our CVC System lessening the time spent for data entry.

ND does not use any VOCA Administrative funds.
