Claims are entered on the date received; assigned a claim number and an investigator; ACIC (criminal history) is an on victim or claimant; The claim is then acknowledged by investigator and information requested from law enforcement, medical, employers, therapist, etc. Upon receipt of requested information a detailed summary of the victimization is done with recommendation of award, deny, delay or closed. If award, eligible payouts will also be detailed in the summary.

Due to state budget cuts we had a major issue with funding . . . Forensic Payments were halted for 3 months; and an allocated payment limit was put in place for the remaining VOCA funds - until the state funding was replenished.

There is no differentiation in serving federal and non-federal victims as long as the eligibility criteria have been met. All efforts ae put forth to serve all victims of criminally injurious conduct.
