1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**  
The California Victim Compensation Board (CalVCB) received 20% fewer applications during the reporting period compared to federal fiscal year 2019-20. Although it is difficult to pinpoint the precise reason(s) for the decrease, it is suspected that many crimes were unreported, possibly as a result of the continuing impact of COVID-19.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**  
Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 34  
  
Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The average processing time is calculated from the day the application is received by mail, fax, email, or online portal to the day the eligibility recommendation is made. Upon receipt applications are scanned into CalVCB's claims management system. Application intake staff perform data entry, verifies all pertinent fields of the application are complete and that some form of crime documentation has been received. If pertinent fields are incomplete, or if required documentation is missing, staff calls and writes the applicant to request additional information. Lastly, eligibility determination staff review crime reports or other documentation to ensure there is a qualifying crime and makes allow or deny recommendations accordingly.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**  
None
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**  
CalVCB works closely with advocates from the FBI Victim Assistance Program and other federal agencies to help them assist victims of federal crimes, including mass violence events that occur in California or where a large number of California residents are involved. CalVCB has a Mass Violence Response Team and a Mass Violence Response Plan to quickly mobilize if mass violence events occur. CalVCB also works with the International Terrorism Victim Expense Reimbursement Program (ITVERP). One CalVCB staff member has been designated as the single point of contact for ITVERP and regularly communicates with the program when California citizens are victims of terrorism outside the United States.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**  
CalVCB trained system-based victim advocates in most of the California counties in the use of the advocate portal. The portal enables victim advocates to help facilitate the electronic application submission process via CalVCB Online. CalVCB Online is a secure and private portal that can be easily accessed from a phone, tablet or computer. With CalVCB Online victims can: Apply for compensation Upload and submit documents Communicate with CalVCB The advocate portal allows advocates to view and track applications in-process for the victims they represent.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**  
The VOCA Administrative funds were used to partially fund three contracts with local processing offices in Los Angeles, San Bernardino and Riverside. These offices processed approximately 23.8% of all applications during the reporting period. These offices are based in District Attorney s offices throughout the state and are instrumental in helping CalVCB meet the needs of victims given the large geography and population of California.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**  
Yes, a bill was introduced and approved into law that established a limited-term program for victims of forced or involuntary sterilization. The law provided for compensation for victims of the State s eugenics laws that existed in California between 1909 and 1979, and victims who were coercively sterilized while a resident of State hospital or while in the custody of a correctional institution. The program will begin implementation January 1, 2022.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**  
Executive Officer Lynda Gledhill re-established the CalVCB Advisory Committee to connect more directly with stakeholders, including district attorneys, victim service providers and victim advocates. The quarterly meetings, conducted online, provide a forum for stakeholders to address common problems and allow CalVCB to communicate about emerging victim issues.
10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**



With funding from a \$2 million outreach grant from Cal OES, CalVCB hired five limited-term advocates who worked with stakeholders and assisted victims statewide. CalVCB also utilized the grant to print thousands of copies of publications providing information about CalVCB and its services, translated several publications into 14 different languages, and mailed many of the publications to people and agencies helping victims across the state. All CalVCB publications can be found on its website. During the state fiscal year 2020-2021 CalVCB distributed over 74,000 pieces of material to stakeholders. Stakeholders statewide requested publications to distribute to their clients. CalVCB's Victim Restitution Guide Brochure was the most frequently distributed publication. This publication provides information about how restitution works and about CalVCB benefits that are available when there is no other source of reimbursement. CalVCB completed several online outreach efforts during the reporting period to increase awareness of CalVCB, including through social media, such as Facebook, Twitter and YouTube.
