Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Explain the responsibilities of your office in processing a claim: Guam has a centralized system, within the Office of Attorney General of Guam (OAG), administering the Criminal Compensation Program (CICP) and assisting the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC). The CICP engages in the following activities: processing applications, providing legal review to the CICC, disbursing funds, providing on-going technical assistance, and routinely monitoring state standards relative to baseline claim processing requirements for local crime victim compensation programs. How long does it take to process a VOCA claim? Pursuant to Guam law, an applicant shall be notified within twenty (20) business days from the date their application is submitted as to whether applicant meets all statutorily eligibility requirements and whether application is complete. Applicant is then informed as to the date and time in which the CICP will hear the case. How long does it take to cut a check for a VOCA claim? The CICP generally disburses compensation funds on a quarterly basis upon receipt of the signed payment authorization order of the CICC.

When we have a Federal case, we work directly with the FBI advocate/liaison to get the information needed in a letter format which answers the critical questions needed for us to move forward with processing the claim.

No notable activities to report at this time.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**  
VOCA funds continue to assist the State of Georgia in providing direct benefits to victims and witnesses of violent crimes, as well as their families. In addition to benefits, our VOCA funds help us to sustain staff critical to the work we do to ensure we give the best service to crimes victims. For example, our Customer Service staff continue to ensure that claim statuses, information needed to process claims and payment information can be readily provided without victims having to be transferred to another staff person.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**  
During the 2021 legislative session, the state passed HB141, which will deem all medical payments made to providers on the behalf of a crime victim as "payment in full." It will also provide for the application of the workers' compensation fee schedule to medical bills received. HB 141 will not be effective until July 2022. However, it is anticipated that, once implemented, both crime victims and the program will benefit from cost savings of paying a reduced cost for medical expenses.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**  
Our VOCA Assistance administrator, which is housed at CJCC, continues to partner with our State Prosecuting Attorneys office to fund advocates serving as a direct liaison for the Victim Compensation program. This joint effort has helped to alleviate some of the barriers victims are faced with.



10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**

Due to the pandemic, public outreach efforts have been expanded to include a greater social media presence (e.g., Facebook, Instagram, YouTube). We continue to attend and present at conferences and trainings to increase awareness, program visibility and education. In addition, we are working with a consultant to identify other opportunities to expand the reach of the program, particularly in underserved communities.
