2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 90

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Once we receive an application two letters are mailed out. The first is mailed to the victim/claimant asking them to specify which benefits they are asking for. Letter gives them 30 days to respond. The second letter is mailed to the law enforcement agency requesting information and copy of the police report. When we receive the police information a determination is made on the claim, or if more information is needed a request is sent to the prosecutor's office. Once information has been received, a determination is made. If we decide to deny, a letter is mailed to the victim/claimant giving them 30 days to appeal our decision. If we approve the claim the providers will be contacted in order to determine how much is still owed the provider and if any payments were received from the victim/claimant. Once all bills are verified the claim is officially approved and the bills are forwarded to the accounting department for payment by a separate agency. If an appeal is received from a denied claim, the appeal is forwarded to our legal department for review. Id need be, a hearing will be scheduled with an administrative law judge we abide by their decision.
