Due to Covid-19, there has been an overall decrease in applications submitted to the program.

2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 64

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Upon receipt of an application it is reviewed for completeness. If an application is incomplete, a request for further information is sent to the claimant. If this information is not received within 60 days, a follow up phone call is made to the claimant. If the claim is complete, a claim number is assigned and if additional information is required, a request for information is sent to the claimant and we also request a Law Enforcement Verification from the law enforcement department in the jurisdiction of the crime. Upon receipt of all documentation the claim is reviewed for eligibility or denial. If a claim is eligible, all bills are reviewed to ensure they are eligible for payment. An Award is entered into the claims management system and sent to the Manager for approval. The account tech then certifies the award in SIGMA (states payment system) and a disbursement of funds is processed to claimant or providers. Funds are dispersed weekly or bi-weekly depending on case load.
