Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Claim is received by the CVR program via mail, fax, email or portal. The claims are processed in the order they are received by the program. All submitted billing statements are verified with their respective service providers for accuracy, relatedness to the injury, and amounts. Also, if loss of wage is a consideration, verification from employer is included in the process. A claim summary is prepared for the hearing officer, and the claim goes to the hearing officer for a decision based on statute and rules & regulations of the program. Once a decision is rendered, CVR staff communicates that decision to the applicant. If eligible for payment, that is then completed within the next business month. CVR staff consults with agency legal counsel as necessary.

Federal crime victims are eligible to apply to the CVR program for assistance and the CVR staff will assist as necessary and coordinate with applicable assistance programs.

## 6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

The CVR program continues to evaluate ways to improve processes and assist more victims. In addition, the CVR program has and continues to work with the Nebraska Victim Advocacy Program to assist victims who may not be eligible for CVR or that CVR cannot assist because what they are seeking assistance with is outside the scope of CVR.

#### Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

The administrative funds are used for printing costs, postage, memberships, meeting costs of our CVR Committee, and travel expenses for the annual VOCA conference. These are all necessary expenses that allow our program to operate efficiently.

## <sup>8.</sup> Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

Yes. Two laws became effective August 28, 2021. These allow 1) medical providers to apply directly to CVR with a victim/survivor's consent for medical expenses related to sexual assault, domestic violence, and child abuse, and 2) removes the 72 reporting requirement for victim/survivor's of sexual assault, domestic violence, child abuse, or sex trafficking if they report to law enforcement, obtain a protection order related to the victimization, or present for a forensic medical exam. Also, an update to the Rules and Regulations (Nebraska Administrative Code) removed the notary requirement from the application.

Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

The CVR staff reaches out to applicable victim assistance agencies for clarification on claims questions, assistance in obtaining information for claims determinations, etc. Also, the CVR staff is available to answer any questions the victim or victim assistance agency may have while the claim is being completed. The CVR program continues to evaluate ways to improve processes and assist more victims.

The CVR staff has attended conferences relating to victim services, will speak to victim assistance agencies as requested regarding any questions the agencies may have, and will continue to update those agencies on any changes that may occur.

## <sup>12.</sup> Please provide any additional comments that are helpful to improving the Victim Compensation state and/or federal program.

The CVR program operates as efficiently as possible with a limited staff. The program is funded through general appropriations, work release funds, court fees, and some funds from the Nebraska prison industries program. Unfortunately, these funds are not sufficient to address all victims who file claims for compensation. While the Federal funds cannot cover all remaining claims for compensation, they are vital to allowing Nebraska to assist additional victims who would not otherwise receive assistance. At this time, the following crime types are eligible for consideration under Nebraska's CVR program: Homicide, Child Abuse/Sexual Assault, Robbery, Domestic Violence, Arson, Kidnapping, DUI, Sexual Assault, and Felony Assault.
