The number of claims applications received during this reporting period is down from previous years. We have noticed an increase in claims submissions for the last two quarters of this period when compared to the same period last year.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Upon receipt of a claim application, either electronically through the Victim Service Portal or paper, the claim is assigned to a Crime Victim Specialist. The Specialist will request documentation to establish eligibility and render a decision. Some expenses could be paid in the original decision. If additional documentation is needed for medical expenses, the claim will be referred to the Additional Medical Unit where staff will then reach out for additional information and process any further medical expenses that arrive in the future.

4. Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

Although there was an increase in the number of emergency awards submitted to NYS OVS from 7/1/21-9/30-21, that trend did not have an impact on our program's ability to meet the needs of victims of crime during that time period. One prospective issue remains the declining revenues to the State's Criminal Justice Improvement Account. It is not an immediate issue because the account can run in the negative but does require action at the NYS level to ensure that NYSOVS services and payments can continue in their current form.

^{5.} Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

OVS continues to work with the FBI and neighboring states to prepare for mass casualty events. OVS staff has also begun to partner with municipalities within the state to prepare for any events that OVS can assist with on a county or more regional level.

^{6.} Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

OVS Compensation has hired a business analyst who has mapped current workflows and is analyzing business processes to determine where improvements in efficiency would be most beneficial. OVS has been working internally to streamline FRE claim processing as well hosting weekly meetings allowing staff to ask payment questions of subject matter experts.

7. Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

OVS primarily uses our VOCA Compensation administrative funds to support staff that are dedicated to the processing of claims and compensation payments. These funds also support operational expenses such as translation and language access services, records management, call center support, and shipping expenses. These funds are essential to our ability to continue providing quality services to victims of crime and to process claims applications in a timely manner.

^{8.} Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

Chapter 233 (Signed: 10/07/2020, Effective: 04/05/21): Defines "employment-related transportation expenses" for the Office of Victim Services as the costs in excess of those normally incurred by a person, due to their personal physical injury(ies) as the result of a crime. Such expense to be reimbursed at no more than \$2,500, for the period of time necessary, as determined by the relevant medical information.

9. Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

OVS Compensation has long-standing, ongoing working relationships with other state agencies and VAPs to ensure the Compensation Unit can obtain records necessary to process claims in a timely manner without placing the burden on victims to obtain information. OVS has an Advisory Council that meets quarterly that allows open discussion between OVS personnel and external stakeholders to address any barriers to victim compensation.

OVS staff usually attend various community events and participate at information tables at several conferences throughout the state. This has been limited during the previous year but we have participated in many events virtually and have met with a new Victim Services office under the auspices of the NYC Mayor and with groups representing culturally specific populations. OVS has also hired a community engagement liaison to increase our efforts and engagement with external stakeholders and victim representatives.
