1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

During this reporting period, there were no significant changes in the number of applications received.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Application is received, screened, and reviewed for duplication, accuracy, and completeness by Victim Support Staff. Required documentation, including the Law Enforcement Incident Report, Supplemental Report, Traffic Accident Report (TR-310), guardianship documents, if applicable, are requested (if not submitted with the application). Data entry is performed on the application, which creates a computer generated claim number. Victim/claimant is notified in writing that the application has been received. Application is then scanned and all attached documents are forwarded to Eligibility Services Department for recommendation. Eligibility Services staff review law enforcement reports and submitted documentation to determine eligibility status in accordance with state statute and eligibility criteria. A recommendation is made and the claims are forwarded to manager or designee for approval. All additional documents are scanned into computer system. Victim/claimant is notified in writing that the claim is deemed eligible or ineligible.

The number of applications received and processed during this period is consistent with the number of applications processed last year.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

Our agency continued to train and educate advocates working with federal victims and continued to have a great rapport with these advocates throughout this period. We continue to collaborate on various training events such as our annual victim rights week conference as well as other regional events. This is done in an effort to ensure that these advocates are aware of our updates, internal processes, and procedural changes as warranted so that these victims can continue to receive quality service.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

We are continuing to send out quarterly newsletters and regular EBlasts! to advocates throughout the state on various topics relevant to our work.

We did not use VOCA administrative funds during this reporting period.

Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

We are working with our partners throughout the state to process and pay claims. Some of our training and communications have gone virtual due to the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic, but that hasn't changed that our agency has worked and continues to work very diligently with various stakeholders in training and educating them on our programs, services, and benefits. We have worked in a collaborative effort with various law enforcement agencies, advocates, and non-profit groups as our office hosted a regional training. We worked closely with the South Carolina Victim Assistance Network (SCVAN) on the annual SC Victim Rights Week Conference which was conducted virtually. In addition, we have a policy in which staff members must conduct field visits at least six times a year to meet and educate criminal justice personnel about our work. This of course has been limited due to the pandemic. We have built and continue to build strong partnerships that we hope will continue to enhance the number and quality of applications received for compensation.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

During this reporting period, our agency has coordinated and conducted 22 training events across the State of SC and trained 797 participants. Due to the Coronavirus pandemic, some of the trainings were conducted virtually. The training events were for various groups such as hospitals, law enforcement agencies, district attorney offices, churches, child advocacy centers, schools, sexual assault facilities, domestic violence shelters, and other organizations providing direct victim services. Our agency also continued monthly and/or quarterly EBlasts! for Restitution and the Sexual Assault Program. The emails are distributed to various hospital officials, advocates, court officials, and law enforcement.

We will continue to work with victims and those that assist crime victims across the state to ensure that all eligible crime victims will receive the same quality of service.
