The State of Texas saw an increase this year in victim applications and sexual assault exam applications received. This was the second year of processing sexual assault exam applications directly from health care providers as required by a legislative change. This change contributed to an increase in sexual assault exam applications received.

Texas calculates the days to process an application for claim eligibility from the date the application is received to the date an eligibility determination is made. If an application is received without needed victim, claimant, or crime information, the program requests the necessary information and may place the application in suspense.

The State of Texas continued to be affected by COVID-19 which has had an impact on staffing and victim applications received.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

The Texas CVC program continues to assist federal victims of crime in the same fashion we do for all victims.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

Texas has made continued improvements to the Crime Victim Management System (CVMS) web portal which provides victim registration for online accounts, an enhanced online application, the capability to upload documents into claims, and enhanced online views for victim advocates and medical providers.

7. Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

VOCA Administrative Funds were used in FFY2021 for modifications, support, and enhancements to the online CVMS web portal that allows applicants to apply and manage their claims online.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

The Texas Legislature passed HB 2462 and HB 2706 during the 87th Legislature, which made changes regarding sexual assault examinations and the reimbursement process. Changes in the legislation will increase the number of exams conducted in the state and the reimbursement requests for those exams. HB 2462 amended Code of Criminal Procedure provisions regarding law enforcement requests for sexual assault exams, including: - Removing provisions regarding false reports that allow law enforcement to decline requests for exams of an adult within 120 hours of assault. - Requiring that law enforcement request exams of children even if the assault was beyond 120 hours. - Clarifying situations where exams may be conducted for adults after 120 hours if law enforcement believes it would further investigation or prosecution or if a medical provider / examiner notifies law enforcement that an exam should be conducted. HB 2706 amended Code of Criminal Procedure and the Health and Safety Code to designate SAFE Programs as a SAFE-ready facility – making the entities eligible to receive payments for the cost of medical care related to the sexual assault exams. CVC reimburses health care facilities, sexual assault examiners, or sexual assault nurse examiners for the forensic costs of sexual assault exams conducted after 8/31/2019. Reimbursement requests must be submitted within 3 years of the date of the exam. Reimbursement is available for both non-reported sexual assaults and reported sexual assaults. Medical care associated with the exam may also be reimbursed under CVC or as Emergency Medical Care Compensation.

Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

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The CVC program provides training for law enforcement, prosecutorial offices, victim advocacy groups and service providers on the Rights of Victims and the Crime Victims Compensation program including eligibility and claims processing. Additionally, Texas has five regional coordinators who are responsible for implementing professional training programs for criminal justice professionals. Finally, the Texas OAG provides grants with state funding of \$2.49 million to fund victim assistance coordinators and crime victim liaisons located within police departments, sheriffs , and prosecution offices. These positions provide direct services, assist with applying for compensation, and understanding victims rights.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

The Texas OAG provided online training to 1,208 participants during the reporting period. Additionally, outreach was provided to 77,003 recipients. This includes outreach through our website.
