The application is then assign to a Claim Examiner, who process payment requests and interact with the claimants for the remainder of the process.

Victims were given the ability to submit applications online through Pro bono net, and CVCP also increased the hours of operations for walk-in services to pre COVID hours.

The Superior Court uses VOCA Administrative Funds to subsidize the salary of the personnel working within the Crime Victim Compensation Program.
