Georgia has a centralized system for the administration of crime victim compensation program applications, which includes processing of applications and disbursement of compensation funds. The Georgia Crime Victims Compensation Program s responsibilities include 1) document processing – scanning in mailed applications; 2) intake – entering in scanned applications into the claims management system and checking applications submitted through the portal for accuracy; 3) verification – verifying bills with the vendor; and 4) claims investigation - reviewing the claim against federal and state requirements, and eligibility. In addition, customer service staff and advocates work directly with victims to ensure they are able to obtain the documents they need for a complete application.
