1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

We ran a marketing campaign in the fall of 2021 to increase awareness of our program around the state. We have more than doubled the number of application we would normal receive.

2. The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation

Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 90

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. 1) New applications are received and entered into our claims system. 2) Once assigned to a claims analyst, two letter a mailed. One to the victim/claimant requesting bills related to the crime along with other information. The second to law enforcement. If no information is received from victim/claimant within 40 days, claim denied. Once police information is received, and the victim is eligible, and bills are present, bill verification is done for all bills being paid. If a victim's claim is denied, the victim/claimant has the right to request an appeal hearing. Agency will abide by the ALJ's decision.

Continuing efforts to improve our claims processing system. Temporary employee hired to help with increased work flow.

The salaries of the victim compensation staff are paid using administrative funds. Also travel to attend training designed to increase knowledge.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

Yes, house bill was passed allowing our department to pay for crime scene cleanup, along with window and door lock replacement. It also removed the reporting requirement for sexual assault victims as long as they received a forensic exam.

Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

The State Compensation Program has excellent working relationships with all of the above mentioned community partners. The program is constantly offering education and assistance to our community partners in order to maintain strong working relationships with everyone. Our VOCA Assistance team is in the same office as VOCA Compensation so we are easily accessible to answer questions that come up regarding compensation.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

Hope & Helps Indiana is a public outreach campaign launched in the fall of 2021. As part of this outreach effort, a separate website was setup to answer specific questions about our program such as who is eligible and how to apply
