Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. 1) New applications are received and entered into a database by a Claims Processor. 2) New workloads are evaluated for eligibility by the Claims Examiner and missing documentation is requested. 3) Claims Examiners submit reviewed claims with Decision recommendations to the Claims Supervisor. 4) The Claims Supervisor reviews all claims for accuracy and submits Claim Decision and Supporting Documentation to a five (5) member Board. 5) The Board reviews all claims for Approval or Denial leading to an Interim Decision. Interim Decision is mailed to the Claimant. 6) The Claimant has fifteen (15) days to Appeal an Interim Decision to the Board. Appealed Interim Decisions result in Hearings. The result of any Hearing may be to Affirm, Modify, or Reverse the Interim Decision. 7) After the fifteen days has elapsed the Interim Decision is forwarded to the Executive Director/Designee to be reviewed a signed resulting in a Final Decision.

The easing of COVID-19 restrictions have lead to a small increase in the number of claims.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**  
We have an ongoing working relationship with the Federal advocates and open communication with Federal crime victims. We continue to provide trainings as requested by agencies that provide direct assistances to Federal crime victims. We have initiated a dialogue with the Native American communities and advocacy programs to provide information and education regarding services we can provide to Native Americans.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**  
We are in the process of implementing a new claims management system that will allow victims to apply on-line and will provide staff a streamlined approach to providing efficient and timely processing of claims.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**  
VOCA funds have allowed our program to fully compensate victim benefits under the many expansions of coverage. Without these funds, we may not be able to provide full payment of out of pocket loss for our victims, up to our maximum.

We continue to be part of the Prosecuting Association of Michigan training programs along with on-going training to advocates, VOCA grantees, law enforcement and other community groups.
