Appealed decisions result in Hearings. The result of any Hearing may be to Affirm, Modify, or Reverse the Decision. 6) After the fifteen days has elapsed the Decision is forwarded to the Executive Director/Designee to be reviewed a signed resulting in a Final Decision.
