Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Once an application is received it is entered into UOVC's database and is assigned to the next Reparation Officer in line. Letters are automatically generated to the victim acknowledging the receipt of the application and to law enforcement requesting a report. Once a police report is received and other information if needed, the Reparation Officer will render a decision. Once a decision is rendered a letter will go to the victim informing them of the decision. If it is a denial it will state the reason for denial and let them know they may appeal the denial. If it is an approval, it will let them know what benefits they are approved for.

Our office also administers the VOCA Assistance, VAWA Assistance and SASP Assistance grants for our State. Our Compensation processing staff meet and train alongside our victim assistance staff as well as victim advocates and service providers from around the state. They are also involved in needs assessment and other planning meetings with stake holders statewide. Our office coordinates the Utah Council on Victim of Crime, a statutory body with the responsibility of driving policy and law that affects victims. The Council is composed of 24 voting members and is comprised of leaders from law enforcement, prosecution, US Attorney and other agencies. The office initiated extensive outreach to the Utah Tribal and Native American Issues Committee and with our Director attends all Utah Tribal Leaders' meetings to be accountable to and report to Tribal leaders and success, solutions and ongoing issues regarding victimization in Tribal areas.

UOVC utilizes staff members, our office Victim Advocates, Reparation Program Manager and the Director to conduct public outreach and training services for the Compensation Program to Hospitals, schools, Tribal leaders, police agencies and academy, non profit agencies just to list a few.
