## NARRATIVE QUESTIONS

1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**  
During this period, the program experienced staffing turnovers and at times had no administrative staff to input applications. Our decreased numbers from this quarter are a direct result of gaps in personnel.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**  
Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 165  
  
Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. 1) New applications are received and logged into a database by an administrative assistant. 2) The application is then checked to ensure it is complete and entered fully into the database. Typically within 30 days. 3) Once the application is entered, the administrative assistant requests documents from LE/PE. Once those items are received, the application is marked as 'pending' and awaits eligibility determination by case managers. 4) Case managers review the application, and reports to determine eligibility. This goal is for this to occur within 30 days of the file being pended. 5) Once eligibility is determined then the claimant is notified.

This quarter staffing turnover was our biggest obstacle.

The program is continuously trying to find new ways to serve victims. Despite staff turnover, our outreach goals were unchanged. It is important to remain at the forefront of mind with our stakeholders and community partners.

The program adjusted internal processes within the Administrative Assistant positions. The program will now have two persons entering applications instead of one. We hope this will decrease days that an application is waiting review for eligibility determination.

The program does not use any grant funding for administrative needs.

The Administrative Rules for the program were opened for review and adjustments will be presented during the next legislative session.

This connectivity is to request documentation and discuss cases that may need CVCP assistance.

The program has a formal outreach plan which is updated annually. The program also just implemented a program awareness team. The team will assist the bureau chief in finding new audiences and partners.

Quarterly the program reports on sexual assault exam expenditures to the State's Legislative Services Office.
