The number of applications for the period 10/1/2022 to 9/30/2023 increased by 1103 claims (21.6%) over the prior reporting period. The prior year had an increase of 27%.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The claim application is entered into our Claims Processing System either on-line (by Claimant or Victim Witness personnel) or through mail-in/fax paper copy. The Intake unit will review the application and determine if the claim can be forwarded to our Investigative unit. The Investigative unit will then determine eligibility, process the claim according to statutes and forward to supervisors for final review and approval. Payments are verified by the Office fiscal unit then forwarded to the office of the Attorney General fiscal unit for final approval and check issuance.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**
Beginning July 1, 2022, a pilot telework program was initiated by the Department of Law and Public Safety. The program includes both office and remote work schedules. The program is continuing with 90% of the staff participating. The New Jersey Victims of Crime Compensation Office is fully capable and budgeted to fully meet its needs.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**
The agency's Intake Unit works closely with the FBI and Federal victim advocates to serve federal crime victims. The Agency's staff are also members of the Human Trafficking Task Force which allow collaboration with Federal and State agencies.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**
The office continued to incorporate technology initiatives in order to improve our victim compensation services to victims, providers and advocates. A complete re-write of the Claims Processing System continued this past fiscal year with a new public interface being successfully rolled out. The staff continues to test new modules being developed.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**
The funds were used for information technology, operations and training to improve victim compensation services.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**
In October, 2022 the Office of Violence Intervention and Victim Assistance (VIVA) was established. The Victims of Crime Compensation Office (VCCO) was transferred from the Division of Criminal Justice to this new Office (VIVA). The new Office assisted the VCCO with outreach programs and other victim based tasks.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**
Efforts to expand our technology based initiatives are ongoing. Claims initiated by the County Victims Witness units through on-line filing are increasing. Direct online filing by victims and claimants have also increased since the program was initiated.
10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**
The VCCO Public Outreach Committee is structured to inform our stakeholders and supporters about training opportunities, resources and materials to both public and private organizations, first responders, prosecutorial staff, faith based communities and constituents. The VCCO sponsors annual events and campaigns; such as Crime Victim's Right's week held every April, Domestic Violence Month, held every October, Bullying, Sexual Awareness and other violence related monthly topics in our continuous efforts to promote awareness and meet the needs of the communities. In partnership with the Office of the Attorney General, the Agency's sponsored events are publicized and published via media outlets and our website. Following the Office's incorporation in to VIVA, the Office has enhanced it's visibility with increased outreach events.
